Absences

We are required by Surrey County Council to send in an absence return every half term. As a result we ask that on the first morning of absence parents ring the school office and leave a message by 9.25a.m. explaining the reason for his/her absence. If a child is away and we do not get a message to explain, we will contact you to ensure your child is safe If we are unable to contact you we will work our way through the contacts on your information form. Please ring the office every morning of your child's absence.

Request for Leave of Absence during term time

We will not normally authorise absence for holidays during term time and any such absences will be marked as unauthorised. Surrey County Council guidance gives Headteachers the power to authorise absence only in exceptional Examples of exceptional circumstances. circumstances, given by the Department for Education (DfE), are: service leave and family crisis.

Pupil Post

We try to use Friday as our regular day for sending parent mail and newsletters. Please check your emails and your child's bag on a Friday to ensure that you keep up to date with school events. We would also be grateful if you could help your children on a weekly basis, to clear their bags of all unnec-



essary items (apart from reading books and diaries). Sometimes it is unavoidable to send mail on other days so please bear this in mind. We update the website regularly with important information.

Updating Records/Information

Your child will receive an envelope next week which shows the details we currently hold. Please



return the form unchanged and signed if the details are correct, but, if they are not, please alter them clearly on the form. Also enclosed will be 'The Wizard of Oz' theatre performance letter. Tucasi on-line payment registration details have been issued to

new parents and existing parents who have not already registered. We would be grateful if these forms/data collection forms can be returned by **Monday 24th September.**

Medication and Inhalers

If your child receives medication, including inhalers for asthma, please ensure that the school is informed of this and medication is supplied for use in school. As with any medicine/inhalers that need to be given during the day, a form



(obtained from the office) must be completed giving details of the medicines and clear instructions as to how they should be administered. Please refer to our 'Supporting Children with Medical Needs' policy. All medication must come via the School Office and not via the classteacher.

Dogs on School Premises

Please ensure that dogs <u>are not</u> brought on to school premises. Please tie them up to the fence at the front of the school building, away from paths and gates.

Free School Meals Eligibility and Pupil Premium

Although all infant school children are now eligible for a free school meal, it is still important to us that we are able to identify who would have been eligible if the system hadn't changed as this information is used for the school to be able to claim pupil premium-essential funding. You or your child's information is not given to anyone else



but is used purely for the school to be able to claim the premium.

The Pupil Premium is additional funding given to schools so that they can support their disadvantaged pupils and close any potential attainment gaps between

them and their peers. Please pick up a form from the School Office as soon as possible, even if you are not sure whether you are eligible, in order for us to make this claim as accurately as possible.

Bicycle and Scooter Shelter

Can you please ensure that as children come into the school grounds they do not ride their scooters or bikes. Please push them to avoid any unnecessary accidents, particularly during busy times. For our new parents, the



bicycle/scooter shelter is near the side-door of the School Hall.

Photographer

The School photographer will be coming on Tuesday 2nd October to take individual and family group children's photographs. Older and younger children in your family who do not attend our school may be brought into school at 8.45a.m., if you would like

them to be included in your school child's photograph. Priority will be given to older children, so that they can get to their school as soon as Individual and family possible. group photographs of children who attend our school will be taken



during the remainder of the morning.

Parent Helpers and Safeguarding Children

We welcome parent (and grandparent) helpers in school and at 'Friends' events. Please be aware that if you wish to help with the children (in class or school trips) you will need a DBS check from the Disclosure and Barring Service. The school will pay for the cost of this check. Parents can start their own applications on-line (full guidance is available from the office). On-line applications generally take less than a week to process. After this you will be very welcome in school.

Gates Locking/Opening

Please note that all gates will be locked in the mornings at 9a.m. and will be re-opened at 3p.m. Please ensure that you vacate the site promptly after drop-off.

Half term value - 'Resilience'

This half term we will be focusing on the value of 'Resilience'. Each week there will be a values assembly to help the children build their understanding and learn about what each value 'looks like' and how they can 'live' it. The children will learn about how they can be resilient learners and the importance of persevering and adopting a positive 'Milford Mindset'. We ask that you support us by referring to our value at home (and completing a value leaf when the class teachers send them home!) If there is anyone you feel we should be learning about who was or is a model for resilience, then please let us know so we can feature them over the coming weeks!

In assembly this week we talked about being resilient (not giving up when things get tricky and 'bouncing back'). The children watched a video about making resilience promises - things they said they wouldn't give up.
