#### **School Uniform**

Please ensure that your child wears our school uniform each day. Lots of children do this and they look really smart and show great pride - look smart, feel smart! We have noticed recently that quite a few children have not been wearing appropriate footwear. Please ensure that your child wears footwear in line with our policy outlined below.

**Boys Uniform**—Grey trousers/shorts, white polo shirt, grey socks, black shoes and school sweatshirt/cardigan. **Girls Uniform**—Grey skirt, grey pinafore dress or trousers, white polo shirt, grey socks/tights, black shoes and school sweatshirt/cardigan. When the weather is warm girls may wear green & white checked dress, white ankle socks and school sweatshirt/cardigan.

Boys and girls are asked to wear **black shoes** of a sturdy, sensible style for safety at playtimes all year round (no open-toe sandals or boots please).

For PE the children should wear a green Milford t-shirt and navy or black shorts with plimsolls or trainers.

For reasons of safety, it is Surrey County policy not to allow children to wear jewellery for any physical activity. Please ensure that your child does not wear any of these items especially for PE days and we would appreciate your support if all jewellery could be avoided.

I have spent a lot of time in classrooms teaching over the last few weeks and I have thoroughly enjoyed spending time with all of the children. It has been really interesting and exciting to see all of the different learning going on. In Reception I taught phonics, music and we also learnt about different methods of travelling. In Year 1 I have taught English (a recount of the Haslemere Museum visit which the children told me was great!), Art - sketching using different direction pencil strokes (not my strength, but somehow the children produced fantastic work!) and reading. In Year 2 I have had the pleasure of teaching some Science, where Elm Class in particular really impressed me with their independence and understanding of the parts of plants and their function.
