

## Minutes of Friends meeting 7 February 2017

Present: Kelly, Kirsty Morris, Mrs Sz, Linda, Nicola, Bridie, Dani and Penny

# 1. Playground update

Three companies have been in to look at the playground and come up with designs and quotes (Sovereign, Playdale and Greenspan). The designs, while having some features in common, were all different in many ways – as were the quotes!

After looking at the design plans, it was decided to split the redevelopment into two phases – Phase 1 being the actual playground and phase 2 the field. We will concentrate on phase 1 this year, and our fundraising target of £10k will hopefully help to fund the majority of this phase. We will then look at fundraising for phase 2 next year.

### **Action points**

- Kirsty to find out how much the school can contribute towards phase 1
- Kirsty and Mrs S to consolidate the plans and designs and do a scale drawing so it can be determined the best equipment to get (e.g. a big structure is impressive but might not be able to fit many children on at a time, whereas a few smaller structures allow more children to play)

### Ramp update:

Surrey County Council visited school on Monday 6th February to review the potential area for ramp access. Whilst they are unwilling to put it forward as a proposal purely for the sake of buggy access, they said that we could explore the angle of it providing access for disabled pupils or those with mobility issues.

They said that the cost would be £35-40k (the same cost quoted by a private landscaper) and that it might be considered for their new budget year, from 1st April. We are awaiting further news from them but it certainly hasn't been ruled out at this stage.

## 2. General stuff

Financial update – we are waiting for the latest bank statement, but it is believed that we have around £6,600 in the bank. On this basis, and to leave some cash in reserve for the future, we believe we can commit £5k of our current funds to the playground redevelopment – representing 50% of our target. The other 50% will come from the events in the next term and a half, plus any grants we can get.

Friends committee – Dani has agreed to take on the role of treasurer (and on behalf of the Friends, I'd like to thank Bridie for all she has done in the role in the last three years!) No-one has stepped forward to take on the secretary role, but then not many people can make all of the morning, afternoon and evening meetings – it may be easier just to ask someone at each meeting to take the minutes. In terms of a general committee and events volunteers, we will see how things go over the next couple of months. Jessica Martin may be able to run the summer raffle, which would be great! We also need some new trustees, and Gary Smith and Deborah Riseley have been amazing and have volunteered to take on this role.

Friends questionnaires – Kirsty has received some questionnaires back and will collate the replies.
