Bradley: For trying really hard to improve his presentation





### **P.E. Kit**

## WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING IN WILLOW...

### Summer Term 1 – Paws, Claws, Feathers and Fins

We have started our new term and new topic with a bang (or is it a 'mighty splash'?! ) this week! We began the week with an introduction to our new animal-related topic, reading and immersing ourselves in the traditional tale, 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff'. The children developed their language skills by learning to re-tell this fabulous story with the help of actions. They acted out the tale with masks, props and wonderfully expressive voices for the different characters.

- made cut out bridges and goats (developing their scissor skills and understanding of positional language)
