

Dear Parents,

It has been a busy week at Milford School with the visit of the theatre and some wonderful follow up writing from lots of children about the production of Snow White. Thank you all for supporting this with voluntary contributions - it is great for our children to see literature come to life in this way and is something I hope we can continue to provide in future.

On another note, it is still relatively early in the term and there have been the inevitable small number of 'teething problems', requiring some simple early reminders, to help children understand what is expected of them back in school, now that the summer is just a memory. We ask that children:

- Walk inside the school buildings and corridors and when approaching the dining hall at lunchtimes
- Treat each other and their teachers with respect and kindness at all times
- Exercise silence and good listening skills when lining up at the end of playtime, during a fire drill, during reflective assemblies and at other occasional times, when required to do so by teachers
- Arrive on time and leave school promptly at the end of each day, refraining from using the unsupervised outdoor climbing equipment

We rely on the support of parents and I urge you to reinforce our school values, and, in particular, to remind children of the above points. I assure you that we do have the children's welfare and happiness at the heart of everything we do and we firmly believe that it is in children's best interest that they are able to be cooperative, well mannered, to listen well, follow instruction and understand the needs of others.
