1	APOLOGIES: Mel Isherwood will be arriving late. WELCOME: JM welcomed our two newly elected parent governors, Linda Chung and Emma Hardy.					
2	DECLARATION OF INTEREST (conflict and pecuniary) Governors declared no interest in specific agenda items at this meeting.					
3	CONSTITUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY					
	a. There is one parent governor whose term of office is due to expire before the end of the year (Jimmy Heslop) in Nov 2017.					
	b. There has been one resignation since 23 Nov FGB. Nick Reilly resigned with immediate effect after the 23 Nov meeting to allow for the quick election of a replacement parent governor. Governors registered their thanks to Nick for his commitment to the Governing Body and for his foresight in timing his resignation to help the smooth operation of the GB.					
	c. There have been two elections since the last meeting. Following NR's resignation, both nominated parent governor candidates were accepted as elected.					
	 d. Category of any vacancies to be filled: 1x LA – governors are aware of the time pressure to identify a Local Authority nomination in time for the next Panel meeting (completed forms must be submitted by 16 March to be considered). 					
4	MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING The minutes of the previous meeting were agreed as an accurate record and signed by the Chair.					
5	CHAIR'S ACTION (statutory) Nothing to report.					
6	HEADTEACHER UPDATE (statutory) a. School Improvement & Inclusion Partner (SIIP) visit feedback The SIIP, Michael Youlton, is visiting next week so feedback will come out later. He and AS will be looking at SEND data, walking the school and visiting the EYFS to ensure the school is on track to meet the targets identified.					
	b. Email provider change This change has not been without teething problems, particularly in the area of transferring across full parent group contacts.	-				

	Data AS took the new governors briefly through the EYFS data. He confirmed that additional analysis has been undertaken to identify the progress of the groups of SEND, FSM, Pupil Premium.		
	JM explained that AS's introduction of the standardised tests is a useful way of triangulating the teachers' assessments of progress. He has received feedback from teachers, however, that the administration of the tests was onerous and so they will be trialling a different way of implementing them in the spring term.		
	AS informed governors that Infant schools will not be subject to floor standards this year.		
	LB questioned why the progress in maths in Yr2 was slower than in previous years. AS confirmed that the level of maths required by these children is now a step change higher than in previous years. In addition there are a number of children who have specific additional needs (2 have EHCP requests submitted). AS is running a number of interventions with these children to help boost their progress.		
	LC asked how AS would manage a discrepancy between test & assessment data and the teacher assessment. He confirmed that he would expect the teacher to be able to provide evidence in their books to be able to justify their decisions.		
	Ofsted Inspection Dashboard AS showed governors the new Ofsted Inspection Dashboard; the highlights are not necessarily what the SLT would extract from the data, knowing the school's previous performance. He explained how the data has been presented and that, unexpectedly, the government had taken data from the end of Reception — rather than KS1. Comparisons for disadvantaged pupils are with all pupils nationally who are not disadvantaged, and so the numbers differ from the national numbers which include all pupils.		
	JM encouraged all governors who have not yet done so to go on RaiseOnline training.	On-going	As relevant

13	ACADEMISATION JM attended a course just before Christmas. She reported that many of the benefits, financial and otherwise, are falling away, such that the financial disadvantages to non-academy trusts hold the same for academies and MATs. It is likely that the Confederation option will come to nothing as church schools have their options largely tied to the Good Shepherd Trust, so JM and AS are talking at a very early stage with other local community schools about how they might cooperate effectively together. JM reported that she found the course fairly disheartening as becoming an academy does not allow additional freedoms in the areas of e.g. changing status, changing admissions criteria.						
14	CONFEDERATION DEVELOPMENT AS had nothing new to report as the next meeting is on 24 Jan. Headteachers are considering how the Confederation may survive after the coming financial year, which is the last for which it will receive funding.
