#### Year Two Trip to Witley Common

Last week Year Two had a fantastic day at <u>Witley</u> Common. When we arrived we met the National Trust volunteers and they took us to the Centre. During the day each group tried 3 different activities: pond dipping, den building and bug hunting.

Pond dipping was great fun! We looked to see what we could see on the surface of the pond before we carefully used a net to see what was in the water. We found so many newts!







Have you ever heard of a Smooth Newt?

This is the species of newt you are most likely to find in your garden pond. A smooth newt is greybrown, with an orange belly and neat black spots all over.

We loved bug hunting in different areas of <u>Witley</u> Common. We discovered that successful bug hunting requires care and patience in order to not scare off the bugs! We found cheesy bugs (woodlice!), ants, spiders, slugs, centipedes....they were all safely returned once we'd had a good look at them!
