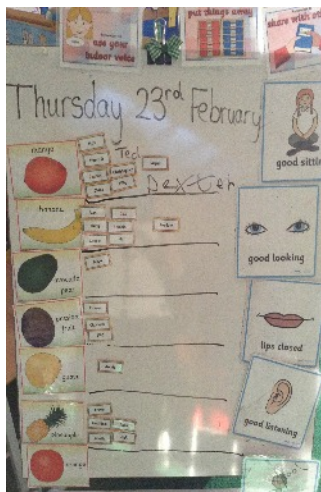

We have now received 3 designs for the school playground, and the School and Friends have narrowed this down to two options. School staff are being consulted at the moment, and parents will be able to view the final design at the forthcoming Parent's Evenings.

We have also received a cash donation of £50 from the grandparents of a Year 1 child. We have not yet been successful in obtaining grant funding, so every penny will count! Thank you to everyone who has contributed so far.

## The Friends - Update

*The Friends have had a fantastic start to 2017 in terms of working towards our playground fundraising target of £10,000! We have pledged £5,000 out of the money we have built up in Friends' bank account (coming from monies raised in the Autumn term and also monies raised in previous years), and everything raised from 1 January goes directly to the playground fund. So far this term we've raised £320 from the film night, £322 from the cake sale (thank you to Cherry class for organising this), £77 from bingo night (thank you to Mrs Szczepanski for being an ace bingo caller), just under £200 from the weekly cake lottos (thank you to Beech and Lime classes for baking and selling), and £288 from the lunchtime yoga classes (thank you to Kate Leonard for donating the proceeds from these).*
