Parking

Please remember to be considerate when parking outside the school, by not parking in the lay-by, the zig-zag lines, and leaving enough access for local residents and emergency vehicle access.

Staff Car Park

Please note that the staff car park is for staff use only due to limited capacity. Breakfast and After School Clubs are not permitted to use the car park for drop off or pick up. If you have a physical disability which requires parking access, please contact the School Office to discuss.

Face Coverings

During drop off and pick up it appears to be increasingly difficult to ensure appropriate social distancing. With this in mind, I'd like to request that parents queueing to enter the premises consider wearing a face covering in order to minimise the risk of the spread of coughs, colds and other potential viruses. In the mornings, Year 2 can enter the premises by bypassing the 'merge in turn' queueing system and go around to the playground. Please stick to your year group's timings to help avoid congestion - it's wonderful that so many parents and children arrive early to school and are excited about being here, however it can add to a bottleneck. So please if you can, take a little longer arriving to school and don't join the line until around 5 minutes before your child's year group is due to start school (8.30 and 2.50 for Reception, 8.40 and 3.00 for Year 1, 8.50 and 3.10 for Year 2).

Free School Meals Eligibility and Armed Forces

Although all infant school children are now eligible for a free school meal, it is still important to us that we are able to identify who would have been eligible if the system hadn't changed as this information is used for the school to be able to claim pupil premi-



um-essential funding. You or your child's information is not given to anyone else but is used purely for the school to be able to claim the premium. The Pupil Premium is additional funding given to schools so that they can support their pupils and close any potential at-

tainment gaps between them and their peers. Please e-mail the School Office on info@milford.surrey.sch.uk for a form as soon as possible, even if you are not sure whether you are eligible, in order for us to make this claim as accurately as possible.

Please also let us know if you are a member of the Armed Forces as this also attracts funding for schools.
