A lot of work has been going on behind the scenes, with improvements to the safety and security of the school site, effective budgeting to ensure our long term sustainability and regular Governing Body meetings to hold School Leaders to account.

It has been great to see how the Friends of Milford School has continued to build its role over the school year, working ever closer with the school to make a difference, not only in providing funds but also developing a sense of community and support that is truly valued. A big thank you to Kelly Davidson and her volunteers for their work in this area. The Governors would also like to welcome Erika Keat as the new Chair of the -Friends and are excited to see how things continue to develop.

The Senior Leadership Team and Governors continue to work to ensure the school remains financially viable and to secure the future of high quality local schooling for the community and this has been significantly strengthened this academic year by the formation of our Cooperative Schools group—The Godalming Learning Partnership, involving many of our closest schools. As part of this work, from September 2019 across our group of school we will be offering School Direct training for up to 6 students from the University of Winchester. This year we have had a successful Ofsted inspection, integrated new Governors into the team, lost Governors for different reasons and are planning to recruit new Governors in September/October 2019.
