Jewellery




For reasons of safety is it SCC's policy not to allow children to wear jewellery for any physical activity. This includes all pierced jewellery including stud earrings.

Year Two News

What a busy half term we have had in Year Two! We started off our summer term in the sunshine under the cherry blossom tree next to our classrooms, where we sketched the beautiful but short-lived blooms as part of our topic on Japan. In English, we have been studying the poem 'If I were in charge of the world', by Judith Viorst.
