NEW - COVID Local Support Grant

Surrey County Council will ensure help is available for families struggling as we transition out of lock-down, through the Government's COVID Local Support Grant. It is designed to directly help families and individuals who have been hardest hit by the pandemic, with the majority set aside to ensure children do not go hungry during school holidays.

The remainder of the funding will be given to the Surrey Crisis Fund and made available to residents who are struggling. This money will provide support towards food costs and utility bills, but also emergencies such as replacing broken white goods, to guide people away from long lasting debt.

Reception Chicks

As part of our Paws, Claws, Feathers and Fins topic, Reception are currently learning all about different farm animals, their young and what they produce. We are eggstremely excited as we have had our very own chick eggs incubating and patiently waited for them to hatch. Last Thursday morning, we began to see some cracks on the eggs and slowly the chicks began to hatch! We learnt that the chicks use their beaks to break free of the eggs and this is called 'pipping'.





Once they had rested we moved them into a cage where we have been carefully looking after the chicks – feeding them, keeping them warm and making sure they have plenty of water to drink. They are already beginning to grow little feathers on their wings.





Soon, a few of the chicks are going to be adopted to live with other chickens in a local free-range environment so that they continue to live their best lives. Milford School are going to keep the rest of the chicks where they will have a new lovely secure home in the hub garden. We are looking forward to continue watching them grow bigger and hopefully one day they will lay eggs for us.



Year 1 - How does your garden grow!

Wow! It's been a wonderful spring term for Year 1. The children have all been really engaged, enthusiastic and thoroughly enjoyed this term's topic 'How does your garden grow?'

We have done lots of fabulous learning outside in the sunshine. Investigating plants that grow around the school, looking closely with magnifying glasses and microscopes and recording our observations scientifically. We have also been growing and nurturing a wide variety of plants and seeds in and outside our classrooms.

In English, we started the term by exploring the story of George and the Dragon – to coincide with St George's day. The children really enjoyed retelling the story with puppets and drama activities and we wrote some fabulous sentences.

The children also enjoyed our English 'Traction Man' module. Based around a story about a boy and his adventures with his action hero toy, Year 1 worked really hard unpicking the text and illustrations, exploring character and setting, before planning and writing their own adventure for Traction Man.

Our new English topic started this week, with a special surprise left in the classrooms. We had some wonderful suggestions of who might own the wheelbarrow – ranging from Mr Macgregor to gold prospectors! However, once the children investigated a little further they found the remains of a picnic...along with Mrs Down's gardening diary...The children will be making their own gardener's diary over the coming week – and we can wait to read them.

We have also been exploring our school value for this half-term - Self Control. We have been sharing stories and discussing it in class.

Some wonderful work has been done in geography, we have been discussing human impact on the local area the common and ways in which we can help protect the countryside.

In maths we have been consolidating our knowledge of shape and place value and we have also revisited addition and subtraction. We have also been looking at the facts we know within 20 and how they can help us to solve problems with small and larger numbers. The children have been having lots of fun all with maths games – including play your cards right!

The children have produced some glorious work in art. We have been learning about Claude Monet, exploring his paintings – especially his wonderful pictures of gardens, ponds and waterlilies - before producing some superb work of our own Milford School pond.
