The opportunity was taken to introduce Grand-parents to Monster Phonics and how best to support their Grandchildren with their reading, as well as to give some information about the school. This included the outcomes for the last year for the end of Key Stage One, which were well above National Average, and above Surrey Averages for reading, writing and mathematics. Wonderful Year One!

What a sensational start to our term we've had in Year One! As part of our 'Marvellous Me' topic, we've explored how we are special and unique. In Science we have looked at developing our knowledge of body parts and understanding our senses. We have also explored seasonal change and autumn discovery!





We have developed our story-telling and writing skills using 'Talk for Writing' and the tale of 'The Enormous Turnip'. This week, we have also been exploring stories and music from around the world and comparing our lives with children in other countries.

We have been comparing and ordering numbers in Maths and learning to use the <, > and = symbols. We have also been developing our subitising (being able to 'see' numbers by using known patterns or number knowledge rather than counting) AND reasoning (explaining how we know) skills.









We have developed our artistic talents by learning how to mix colours and create self-portraits using different media (e.g. sketching, painting and with fruit and vegetables like thoses of the artist Archimboldo).

We have also worked on our gymnastics skills in P.E. – travelling in interesting ways, improving our key 'shapes' (e.g. tuck, straddle and pike) and rotations and rolls.











Finally, in Geography, we've explored our local area and features. We have created our own houses and other buildings to recreate our local area. We shall also be exploring aerial views and creating our very own map for our local walk at the end of this half term.
