Year R news



Reception class has had a wonderful half-term exploring the wonderful world of animals. The children have been full of curiosity as they welcomed a range of special pet visitors, including a fascinating bearded dragon, a tortoise, friendly dogs, shy guinea pigs and even a cat called Kitten. A particularly memorable highlight was meeting visiting hedgehogs Harry and Henry, which sparked lots of thoughtful questions. We loved making our very own clay hedgehogs, pinching the clay to make a pointy nose and adding prickles on its back.

The children have also been proud to share the knowledge they have gained, remembering important facts about animals such as which creatures are nocturnal and which animals hibernate. They have enjoyed asking thoughtful questions about how to care for pets, showing a growing understanding of responsibility and kindness towards living things. We have been inspired to write all about the different animals using our phonics and sight words and trying to remember our finger spaces so that we can read back our writing.





Feeling Good Week

The children took part in a special Feeling Good Week, where they explored ways to look after their wellbeing. They enjoyed a calming yoga session, Binca sewing, spent time in the allotment, and took part in mindfulness activities to help them feel happy and relaxed.



Maths

In Maths, the children have been learning to recall from memory their number bonds to 10, doubling numbers, and exploring odd and even numbers. They have also practised adding quantities, finding one more and one less, and practical sharing amounts equally.



Woodland School

The children had a fantastic time exploring the woodland during their second visit to Woodland School. We had a wonderful time exploring the forest and going on a long walk around the woodland, looking out for wildlife and insects.

The children enjoyed digging in the sand, building castles, and making sand angels. They also had lots of fun building dens, climbing trees, and retelling the story of The Billy Goats Gruff on the bridge. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed playing in the playgrounds, bravely scaling the monkey bars and exploring the equipment.

The children also made magical nature wands using sticks and beautiful natural treasures they found in the forest, such as leaves and pine cones.



Year 1 news



Maths

This half term seems to have gone so quickly, and we have been amazed by how much we have achieved. In maths, we have been enjoying playing a range of different games to practise our skip counting in 2s, 5s and 10s, helping us to build our confidence and fluency.



English

In English, we have learnt about the features of non-fiction texts, including contents pages, headings, labels and captions, and we have been practising how to use these features to help us find information more easily.



PE

In PE, we have been practising our sending and receiving skills through a variety of activities designed to improve our coordination and control. We have also been developing our athletics skills by learning techniques to improve our sprinting, such as arm movement, posture and speed. Alongside this, we have been exploring other athletic events and have especially enjoyed working together in teams to take part in relay races, where we have practised cooperation and communication.





Feeling Good Week

We particularly enjoyed our Binca art afternoon and yoga sessions. We had the opportunity to express our creativity and explore sewing in preparation for our next DT project, hand puppets. While the yoga sessions helped us to relax, focus and develop our balance and mindfulness, supporting our overall wellbeing.

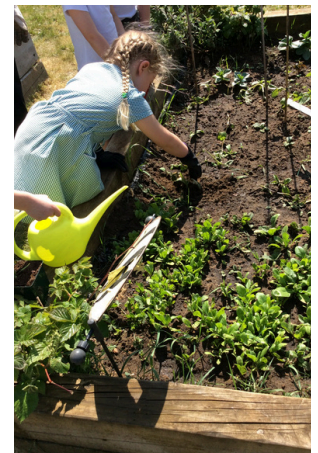


Yoga



Science

In science, we have been learning about the different parts of plants and understanding the role that each part plays in helping the plant grow and survive. We have been taking great care of our allotment plots, where we have planted a variety of seeds and young plants. We have really enjoyed watering and looking after them, and we are excited to continue observing their growth and hopefully see them produce fruits and vegetables.





Woodland School

We have also continued to enjoy our time at Woodland School, where we have been working together in groups to develop our teamwork and problem-solving skills. During these sessions, we have explored our sculpture unit from DT and have created our own natural sculptures using clay and a range of collected materials such as sticks, leaves and stones. We have loved being creative in an outdoor environment and seeing our ideas come to life.

We've had a fantastic half term exploring all things wild in Year 2. The children have worked incredibly hard on improving their writing skills and mathematical knowledge as well as building their geographical and scientific skills.

RE

We kicked off the term with our trip to Woking Mosque and Guildford Cathedral, following our RE learning from the previous term. Then this term we found out about the tradition of Shabbat in Judaism.



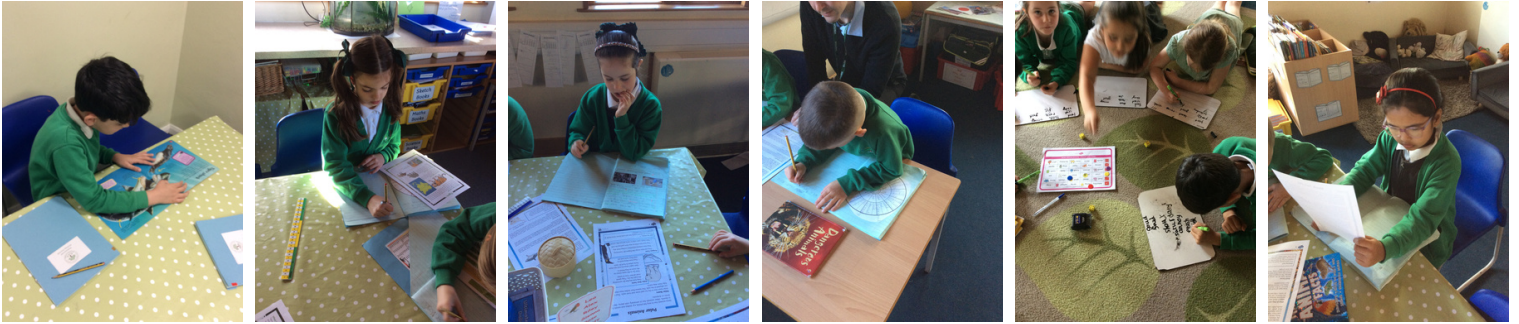
Maths

In Maths, our learning has been based around a lot of problem solving. This has involved all four operations, $+$ $-$ \times \div , and finding missing numbers. We have also been learning about fractions, how to tell the time and then symmetry and rotation with shape.



English

The focus has been on non-fiction texts, leading to researching and writing their own 'fact file' about a wild animal. We have been focusing on the features of a non-fiction book and applying these features, such as headings, sub-headings, captions and diagrams to their own fact file.



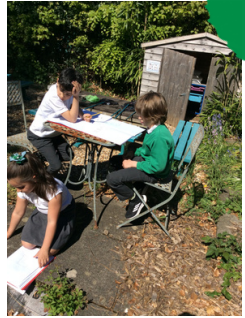
Science

We have become animal experts through our Science topic, learning different habitats and the animals which live there. We looked at large habitats around the world and more locally, including animals we can find in microhabitats in our school grounds. Food chains have helped us learn how animals feed and survive in the wild. We saw many of these animals on our trip to Marwell Zoo.

As part of this year's Summer Fair, school children are invited to take on a gentle obstacle course around the school running track, filled with bright colour stations, music, and plenty of smiles along the way. Participants can run, walk, skip, or dance their way around the course at their own pace while being showered in vibrant non-toxic powder paint.

How it will run on the day:

Tickets must be pre-bought via www.ptaevents.co.uk/milfordschool

Entry to the run is £4 per child and will be for Milford School children only. They will run in year groups with a teacher. A parent can also purchase a ticket if they would like to run with their child.

Parents will line the route (from a paint free distance!) and collect children after the run from the Octagon's outside area, where there will be a cleaning station.

Children must wear eye protection - swimming goggles is recommended, but sunglasses will be a minimum requirement or they will not be able to take part.

We recommend wearing old clothes (white tops work especially well!) and trainers you don't mind getting colourful. Wear this to the fair to be ready to run!
